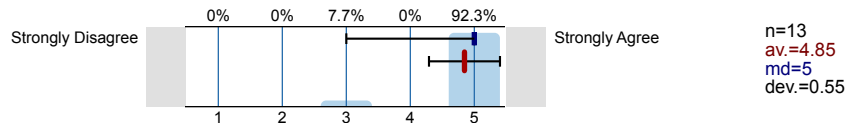

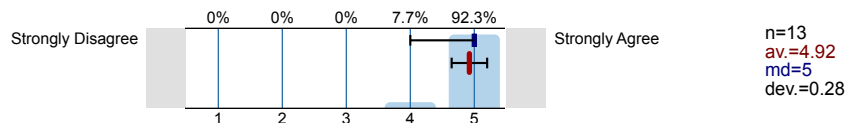

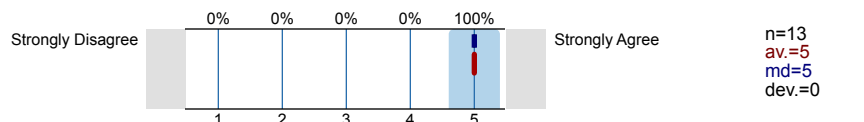

## 5. Open Ended

5.1) The instructor (please comment on questions 4.1-4.7 above)

- Dr. Figueroa is a fine professor who cares deeply about the success and well-being of her students. She regularly asked for feedback from the class about her teaching and the course content and sent several emails to all of us encouraging us to come to her office hours. She is also an enthusiastic teacher and her appreciation for the material we were learning was always evident. It was a pleasure to have her as a professor.
- Dr. Figueroa is an extremely enthusiastic professor who clearly loves what she is teaching. Unfortunately, the topics we had to cover in class were immense and quickly began to mold together until most of us didn't know what we were learning. I would not say this is Dr. Figueroa's fault, only that the course had too much material to cover in a timely and comprehensive manner.
- Dr. Figueroa is incredibly charismatic. She shows enthusiasm every lecture and inspires her students to ask questions and learn more about Spain. She is always available in her office and by e-mail and a great communicator. Dr. Figueroa also provides authentic target language input, and for this reason, I believe my listening comprehension has improved in this course throughout the course. Moreover, Dr. Figueroa always addressed any doubts or confusion about certain topics in class by providing a variety of visuals. Overall, Dr. Figueroa is a great professor, and it is a joy to have learned more about Spain with her guidance.
- I would definitely recommend this class. This class was demanding and challenged you to learn new things. I liked this class very much and my language skills improved significantly.
- She was extremely helpful and and engaging in class and also always made herself readily available outside class. A wonderful teacher to have at 8:35 in the morning because she really pushed us to be engaged even though we wanted to be half asleep.
- The instructor is actually incredibly unique. She is kind, caring, and empathetic while also being a great teacher. She continuously asked for feedback throughout the course to make sure that we were getting what we wanted and needed out of the class.
- The instructor is really great. She always offers help and makes it clear that it is her goal for her students to be successful. She asks for student feedback regularly and takes her position as an educator very seriously. She really wants her students to learn.
- The instructor is very kind and understanding. She always taught with a smile on her face and made everyone feel happy and comfortable. She always asked us if there was anything she could change about the course, and did her best to help us in any way that she could.
- The instructor loves to teach and cares deeply about the success of her students. Her enthusiasm makes boring material a bit more exciting. She communicated all course expectations clearly and was always there to help in and outside of class. I would definitely take a class with her again. The fallback of the course was not in anyway her, but the course materials.
- The instructor provided clear communication of what was expected in the course. Additionally, she was sweet and enthusiastic each day in the classroom which provided the optimal learning environment for her students. If I weren't graduating I would take another course with this Professor.
- The instructor was a huge help and made herself available to students. She was very understanding and tried to help out as much as possible.
- The instructor was very accommodating when I had to miss class on account of another class. She was clear in her expectation for the course and when her availability was for outside help, which was often. Class was run in an upbeat and engaging manner and I appreciated the instructor's enthusiasm for the subject material.

- was one of the most encouraging instructors I've ever had. She was constantly making sure we were all doing well and offering her help in any way possible. But she only sometimes went outside of the course material (powerpoints and textbook). When she did though, the activities were thoughtful and discussion provoking. Discussion in class usually though, didn't go outside of the written questions we had to answer over readings in the textbook.

5.2) The course and the materials (please comment on questions 4.8-4.10 above)

- I do not plan on studying Spanish history, literature, or culture further after this class, because I am more interested in Latin America. But, I will say that the information could be useful for my study abroad in Toledo. The class was not difficult, but the exams could be, but I would still recommend the class and the professor.
- I felt the course and materials were appropriate and full covered the topic.
- I really enjoyed the homeworks because they were thorough without being too much on my plate. The reading guides were harder to keep up with, so I did eventually stop trying to follow them and started just reading the chapter. Some of the in-class activities were not as useful because only the high performers that were confident in their language skills were able to excel in them. Instead of the in-class activities, maybe kahoot would be fun and more useful.
- I was not particularly fond of the course itself. We covered a lot of subject matter in each class, and it was hard to fully understand everything that was happening in class. We did daily reading guides which were easy to fill out, but didn't really challenge me to think more deeply about the material.
- The course and the materials felt almost robotic. We would complete a reading guide and then come to class and go over the questions word for word. I personally do not learn well that way, so I retained almost nothing from this class. I enjoyed talking to my classmates about the history, but I never understood it enough to contribute anything of substance. I most enjoyed completing the tareas and projects. I thought these were more helpful in that they connected what we were learning to the real world. So, with a little work on the structure of the reading guides, this could be a great class.
- The course and the materials were organized well in a way that was conducive to my learning of the Spanish culture.
- The course and the materials were sometimes confusing but in general easy to understand, there were a lot of dates to remember.
- The course taught me enough about Spain's history so that if I had to give an overview to someone, I'd perfectly be able to. Details though, were lost just because they weren't really explored in depth and there was just so much to it.
- The course was exciting and very interesting as this is an area I have learned relatively little about before. The textbook and lectures were very helpful. The homeworks were manageable, although occasionally seemed only loosely related to the subject matter from class. The projects required independent research that was sometimes challenging to fully express but incredibly interesting at the same time.
- The course was fairly straightforward and we generally followed the same schedule in each class: going over the guided reading we had completed the night before and discussing each question in small groups and then as a whole, and then maybe a few minutes of lecture based on a PowerPoint. However, I felt that this was an effective way of covering the kind of historical information that this class is about and I have few complaints about the way the class was set up. We also had 10 supplemental homework assignments throughout the semester that added to the work we did in class as well as an individual project and a group project that each let us explore different aspects of Spanish culture and history that we weren't able to discuss in class.
- The materials provided by Dr. Figueroa were incredibly helpful. I really appreciated the "guía de lectura," or reading guide, because it ensured that I was following important points in the reading. I also really like the project and presentation. These were creative projects that helped me improve my presentation skills and learn about an aspect of Spanish culture in depth. The BlackBoard is incredibly organized and always updated when needed. During lectures, I also enjoyed all the visuals (photos, short clips, timelines) to further my understanding of the topic.
- This course offered a lot of outside readings. The materials were simple and easy to follow.

## 5.3) Self-Evaluation (please comment on questions 4.11-4.16 above)

- I am not very interested in the culture of Spain and sometimes found it difficult to motivate myself to do the homework, projects etc. but the professor did a good job of making the content interesting.
- I attended nearly every class and completed all the homework assignments and projects in time. I also participated regularly in class discussions. I expect to receive an A in this class.
- I believe that I participated well in this course.
- I could have come more prepared for class by doing the reading guides, but overall I feel like I have a better understanding of the material than I did before the class.
- I did not feel challenged in this class, especially when it came to our class presentations. The caliber of Spanish is not high, and neither is the preparation. Many students simply showed up to class without trying on their assignments. I missed a few classes, but do not feel it affected my learning. My skills in Spanish did not improve.
- I do not feel that my Spanish speaking skills have improved very much over the course of the semester. But, I tried my best and had a positive attitude about learning about the history of Spain, even though history is my least favorite subject.
- I learned more than I expected in this course. Due to the structure, I always did the readings and only missed a few days of class because of a cold. I used to think Spain was just another 'European' country but after learning its rich and diverse history, I see Spain in a much different light. I really hope to study there one day and apply my knowledge from this course.
- I missed one class and always completed the homework. This class did not call for much participation, but I regularly volunteered to answer questions. My ability to read and pick out information from the text has improved due to the daily reading guides. I have done many more papers and oral presentations in the past, so this class in particular has not helped me. My language skills have not improved very much in this class, mostly due to not having to come up with my own ideas. We simply said what was on the reading guide.
- I was able to further my skills in Spanish language and culture in this course.
- If I ever felt unprepared for class, it was entirely my own fault and lack of preparation on my own part. However, I feel as though I have put forth a good amount of effort to get the most out of this class.
- My teacher was great. I loved having her as my teacher and enjoyed her enthusiasm.
