# SPAN 3110 Advanced Conversation and Composition



Advanced Conversation and Composition is a course designed to help students improve their Spanish with emphasis on the development of writing skills. In addition to writing, students will enhance their listening, speaking, and reading competence. Students will review grammar rules

through the study of editorials, statistics reports, academic essays, film criticism, description, and narration. We will explore a variety of topics related to cultural and linguistic aspects of the Spanish-speaking world to stimulate the debate, review grammar, and polish writing. Students are expected to complete assignments online and participate actively in discussions. This course is taught in Spanish.

The course number is 11426. The section number is 100.

### Prerequisite:

Completion of Spanish 2120 or Spanish placement level 3110.

- Interact with a variety of authentic media of the target cultures and comprehend the culture-specific references as well as the language
   Understand complex written texts and cultural aspects related to Spain and Latin America
   Identify a range of genres, such as essays, critiques, descriptions, and narrations, in Spanish
   Write narratives, descriptions, and summaries with sustained control of simple target-language sentence structures and partial control of more complex structures
- ☐ Write an original critical academic paper analyzing a short story in Spanish

### **Conversations or Flipgrid\***

Students will choose how they want to address the oral component of the course. Students must send an email or a message via <u>Teams</u> to the instructor during the first week of classes expressing their preference.

In case that the student fails to select an option before or during the last Email Hours of the first week, the default option will be Flipgrid.

\* Once you choose one option, you are committed to that specific option for the entire semester.

#### **Option 1: Conversations with partners**

Students will be divided in small groups and will meet via <u>Microsoft Teams</u> for 30 minutes to discuss topics covered in the class. In all cases, guide questions will be shared in advance. It is expected that the students complete all the assigned readings before joining the Conversation.

The instructor intends to be present during meetings to lead the conversation. However, due to challenges in scheduling, the instructor might not be available to meet with some groups. In this case, the group is responsible to record the conversation and share it with the instructor.

<u>Microsoft Teams</u> is a team-based collaboration tool that provides group chat, channeled conversations, instant messaging, live document collaboration, audio or video calls, and meetings (from one-on-ones to fully-featured audio/video conferences).

#### **Option 2: Flipgrid**

Students will record a 10 minute video discussing topics covered in the class and share it with the instructor via **Flipgrid**. In most cases, guide questions will be shared in advance.

**Flipgrid** is a tool you will use to have asynchronous (not in real-time) group chats.

### **Supersite**

Students will complete online activities through the platform created by *Taller de escritores*, Supersite. The majority of the exercises are taken from the textbook; therefore, it is important to review the assigned lesson before completing it. It is recommended to answer carefully since the online platform is sensitive to the use of punctuation marks.

The assigned homework must be completed by 11:59 PM (Eastern Time) of the due day in order to not lose points.

#### Exams

Students will take three exams during the semester. These exams will be posted on Blackboard and students will have 90 minutes to complete them. Students must send an email to the instructor at least two days before the exam specifying their preference.

In case that the student fails to request a time on the due date, the default time to take the exam will be 1:30-3:00 PM (Eastern Time).

#### Essays

Students will write five (5) short essays during the semester. The essays must be written in double-space, Times New Roman, and 12pts. The topics are related to chapters discussed in class and can be accessed via **Blackboard**.

After submitting the first draft, students will receive a corrected version with suggestions and comments from the instructor using a **Código de corrección**. Students will rewrite the essays incorporating these suggestions and corrections. The grade will be based on the final version.

Both versions must be turned in at the assigned due date. If a student does not submit the first draft on the due date, the version submitted will be considered as final.

To facilitate the editing process, please send essays in Word format to **figuerom@ohio.edu** or share a link with editing access to a Google Doc.

#### **Oral Presentation**

Students will make a group oral presentation about a topic related to a lesson. Group members should meet to make sure that the presentation has coherence. Students can make a video separately and then combine them as a single one, record themselves via Teams, or create a video using PowerPoints with visuals and audios.

### **Final Essay**

At the end of the semester, students will write an original essay following the conventions of academic writing. The length of the essay should be between 600 and 1,200 words.

A single version will be sent via email, as the instructor will not read drafts in advance to offer feedback or correct grammar. For more information about the final essay, see the instructions on **Blackboard**.
